
We are counting down to a celebration of books and reading to mark World Book Week here at St. Pat's!

5TH/6TH CLASS (ROOM 12)



























6TH CLASS (ROOM 18)






We have started the Blue Star Programme for this year - the class did a great job of creating and presenting projects on different landmarks within the E.U.
